Yellow roses symbolize friendship and joy, and new beginnings. The red rose symbolizes romance, love, beauty, and courage. A red rosebud signifies beauty and purity. A thornless red rose means love at first sight.

- 4. Romeo and Juliet, a novel written by William Shakespeare, features Romeo, a young man from the Montague house, and Juliet from the Capulet house. Which one of the following elements of the novel is false?

Juliet is given a potion that makes her seem dead for two days. Romeo arrives at her "deathbed" unaware of the potion, and kills himself. When Juliet awakes from the potion she sees the dead Romeo. She kisses his poisoned lips, and when that does not kill her, buries his dagger in her chest, falling dead upon his body.

Bridegroom, dear to my heart, Goodly is your beauty, honeysweet, Lion, dear to my heart, Goodly is your beauty, honeysweet.

At a matchmaking event he organized in 1998, Rabbi Yaacov Deyo brought along a gragger, the noisemaker Jews use during Purim.
